This viaduct will be the future gateway for thousands of tourists coming to Pullman and our National Monument. On the Friday night before, the award-winning artist Rahmaan Statik, outlined his vision on the blank wall. The next day, the students brought life to the outline. Now the viaduct is a great tribute to President Obama and George Pullman, two men with vision and a love of our neighborhood.

This could not have come to fruition without the help of our neighbors. Alderman Beale was the catalyst to get the City of Chicago to sponsor the artist. Sherwin Williams donated the paint and materials. Chicago Neighborhood Initiatives assisted with student transportation and tee shirts for the volunteers. Pullman Arts supplied team leadership and the 005th District Caps supplied labor as did the entire staff of the 9th Ward Alderman's Office. Neighborhood residents provided breakfast and lunch to the volunteers.

This was a total community project. Special thank you to Jim Badali, Claudia Flores, and Fernando Rosique for cooking the food. Thank you to Larry Lagadinos for assisting in the project managing and the great neighborhood residents who assisted in so many ways.

By the time you read this article, the final touch ups of the mural will have been completed. Walk by and look at the transformation that has taken place done by a community of students and volunteers. On November 16th a small awards ceremony will be held for the students and the official unveiling of the mural will take place. In recognition of their efforts, an area on the south wall will have the names of students who participated. Their names will remain on the wall as long as the mural is still there. We have exciting news to share with our Pullman community. At the PullmanArts October board meeting, a slate of new officers was presented, voted on and unanimously approved. The current PullmanArts Executive Board Officers are: President - Erica Roewade, Secretary - Debbie Newman and Treasurer - John White. The entire Executive Board of PullmanArts would like to thank outgoing officers, Ann Alspaugh, Beverly Ash-Larson and Dee Smith for their tireless dedication, leadership, and generous volunteerism during their three consecutive terms.

The Pullman Artspace Lofts team has received lots of questions lately about the details and timing of the Pullman Artspace Lofts project. The team has put together an update, as well as some answers to questions that have been asked frequently.

A Spring Groundbreaking

The project partners – PullmanArts, Artspace, and CNI – are eagerly looking forward to a Spring 2018 groundbreaking for Pullman Artspace Lofts, the first affordable live/work housing to be built for the community's burgeoning artist/craftsperson population.

Located on Langley Avenue, just south of 111th Street, the housing involves the construction of a new building on an 18,500-square foot empty lot and the restoration of two long-vacant, historic buildings on either side of the lot. The \$18 million development will include 38 affordable, live/work apartments and 2,000 square feet of community space intended for use as a gallery, meeting place, and community room for special community arts classes. Over the winter, the three-organization team is working to finalize construction plans and pricing, as well as to finalize financing details with all the government partners.

In 2016 the project was approved by local, state, and federal authorities to proceed as proposed following the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation of Historic Properties. The Pullman Artspace Lofts will utilize federal Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credits and Low-Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC), which will provide \$14+ million in equity to the project's capital budget. Also in 2016, the project received approvals from the City of Chicago Department of Planning & Development and the City of Chicago Committee on Zoning, Landmarks and Building Standards to proceed as designed. The Commission on Chicago Landmarks has also reviewed and approved the proposed project.

Getting Ready for Construction

Pepper Construction, well-known builder and general contractor for the project, currently is completing the permitting and subcontractor bidding processes. Minority and Women Business Enterprises are particularly encouraged to apply and may contact CNI for more information. Subcontractors can direct information and questions to Ciere Boatright at cboatright@cnigroup.org.

Financing Requirements

In 2016, the Pullman Artspace Lofts project received approvals from the City of Chicago's Department of Planning & Development, Committee on Zoning, Landmarks, and Building Standards to proceed as designed. To ensure affordability to a broad spectrum of artists and their families, including veterans and those with disabilities, the Pullman Artspace Lofts applied for and received approval for rental assistance from the Chicago Housing Authority for six of the 38 live/work spaces. This funding in turn requires one more public input process, which is being managed by the City of Chicago Department of Fleet and Facility Management. The new parkway trees are in!

Community Safety and CAPS:

With the extra hours of added darkness, garage burglaries are proved to spike upwards in Chicago during the winter months, Most burglars are looking for an easy target and the cover of darkness makes life simpler for them. With winter approaching now is a good time to be sure your garage is secure. "Safe" neighborhoods are typically the first place criminals look for their next burglary.

The first tip to prevent garage break-ins is to not leave your garage door open! This is basically inviting burglars in. Breaking in is not the most common way thieves enter a homeowner's garage. Usually, they simply walk into an unlocked or raised garage door. Lock the service door entry to the garage with a quality deadbolt. If you will be away for a few days, unplug an automatic garage door to make it more difficult for a thief to enter.

Install motion sensor lights above your garage door and side service entrance. Enhance security by adding lighting to your back fence and yard. Make sure that alley lights are working and report bulbs that are out immediately by contacting 311.

Place your address in the back of your property on the gate or the garage so if you have to report a burglary, the police can identify the correct location.




