Ramon Statik is our guest and is the artist for the 111^{1th} street viaduct mural project. His work can be seen at www.statikone.net Ramon would like to put in a ballot box in the Visitor's Center to collect everyone's ideas in the project. The scope of the project is to include the past, present and future of Pullman. Need to prioritize what goes on in this first viaduct versus the other viaducts that might be completed throughout Pullman. Ramon discussed his discovery and research phase, which leads to 6 weeks of design work to be discussed by the community, and then a final design. The community will be invited to help paint the mural itself. Alderman Beale is sponsoring this project as the beginning of a series of viaduct projects. High school students will also be working on the mural with Ramon once painting begins.
