February is dedicated for Black History Month which is an annual celebration of the achievements by African Americans. Also known as African American History Month, the event grew out of "Negro History Week," the creation by noted historian Carter G. Woodson and other prominent African Americans. Since 1976, every U.S. president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. The Black History Month 2022 theme, "Black Health and Wellness," explores "the legacy of not only Black scholars and medical practitioners in Western medicine, but also other ways of knowing (e.g., birth workers, doulas, midwives, naturopaths, herbalists, etc.) throughout the African Diaspora. The 2022 theme considers activities, rituals and initiatives that Black communities have done to be well.

Here in Pullman, a PCO committee comprised of dedicated neighbors (Tom Shepherd, Cheryl Briscoe, Lynne Collins, Patty Lawson, and Ranger Ve'amber Miller from the National Park Service) have developed programming to celebrate and educate the public about African American culture and cuisine.

Due to the pandemic, unfortunately this year's in-person activities have been cancelled, but the committee has shared interesting programs via social media to keep momentum and stress the importance of the month.

Feedback gathered earlier this membership year by the PCO Vision committee pointed to the desire of PCO members and community members to ensure a more culturally diverse focus by the organization, and the Pullman Civic Organization intends to invest time and resources to ensure that everyone feels welcome and represented.

To that end, this month's general membership meeting will be held in-person at the Exhibit Hall as opposed to virtually as previously advertised in the Flyer. We appreciate your flexibility as we try to balance meeting access with safety during the difficulties of the pandemic.

Finally, I would like to say that everyone should be interested in Black History Month since Black history is American history. The contributions of African Americans to every aspect of the American culture, including here in Pullman, should be amplified. I would like to thank those historians in the community for sharing pictures and posting about African Americans from Pullman via social media.



In late December, the Chicago Sun-Times and other news organizations reported on the development of a 63,000 square foot hydroponic greenhouse planned for Pullman. The \$40 million project will be built next to the Pullman Wheelworks and is a collaboration between Chicago Neighborhood Initiatives (CNI), Mercy Housing, and Vertical Harvest. In a press release, Alderman Beale stated, "Besides creating good local jobs, the Vertical Greenhouse is a creative solution to address the pressing need for easily accessible nutritious food in the Pullman/Roseland community."

Have you ever attempted to apply for a building permit, only to be stymied by the labyrinthine bureaucracy involved? Or maybe you'd like to apply for a permit fee waiver, and have a few questions? Then join us for this informational working session, at which the (self-appointed) experts of the Beman Committee will be on hand to answer your questions and guide you through the process. And if you're actively looking to apply for a permit or the fee waiver, feel free to bring a laptop and your project's information (including contractor info) and we'll help you apply for a permit or fee waiver live & inperson!

A big congratulations to the recipients of this year's Façade Reimbursement Program! This year the total amount of homeowner investment from qualifying projects is well over \$50,000, representing nearly five times private investment to reimbursement funds awarded. The scope and scale of projects this year also runs the full gamut, from architectural element replication to full-façade restoration. So keep an eye out this year for some stellar restoration projects happening in the community!

And although we're in the middle of winter, there's no better time to start thinking about you own restoration projects for when the weather breaks! Contractors often get booked up fast, so if there's a project you've been putting off for a while now and are ready to take the next step this year, there's no time like the present to get the wheels in motion. Spring will be here before you know it, and with it will come another great season of restoration work in our beautiful town!

Green Spaces and Places: Big Ideas for Small Spaces Lynn Smith

Over the years i've read many books on gardening and garden design While I don't pretend to know everything, the following are some basic design guidelines to get you started:

- 1) Plan (and plant) for four seasons of interest, using both evergreen and deciduous plantings in your design. Bulbs are a welcome addition for Spring. Evergreen hedges if not always trees fit well in Pullman yards.
- 2) Plan your paths entrances sight lines. Think about what views you want to see -- and obscure -- from your house.
- 3) Plant perennials in odd numbered groupings of three, five, and seven to avoid the dreaded "polka dot look". Think about foliage, shape, texture, and finally the color of plants.
- 4) Improve your soil with natural additives like sand, peat, compost, etc. Use of compost is an excellent way to improve the soil.
- 5) Use ornamentation to make your garden special -- bird houses, folk art sculpture, and fountains are a boon for people and animals.
- 6) Use observation and time outside to fine tune your likes and dislikes re. design and the out of doors. When possible use permeable and earth friendly items that have stories to tell.
